Some swimmers were surprisingly hardy on the afternoon of January 1st, making it all the way to the sheriff's deputies in yellow cold-water suits who stood in shoulder-deep water. They gave out high-fives and kept a close lookout for anyone who fell into the water. The air temperature was reported at 35 degrees, and the water was about 36 degrees, organizers said. About 800 swimmers signed up for the event. The \$10 registration fee benefited the Springfield Shriners Hospital's Acute Pediatric Rehabilitation Program and the local fire department.
