Commander Message

Dear Fellow members of USPS

It was sad when the great ship Titanic went down in April 1912 off the Grand Banks of Newfoundland. That same thing happens to me. Well - it wasn't exactly April, it was July. It wasn't exactly the Titanic - it was the "By George" our family 30 foot cruiser. It wasn't exactly the Atlantic Ocean, it was Lake Champlain. It wasn't exactly an iceberg it was a support leg of our swim ladder. Fortunately we didn't exactly go down - but we did get plenty wet.

Here is what happened. We anchored in Partridge cove with a Bermuda anchoring system. I placed our swim ladder over the side and went in for a swim. When I was ready to come out of the water, I placed my foot on the bottom rung of the ladder, the bottom stand-away of the ladder (below the water line) went thru the hull just as I put my complete weight on the bottom rung. Here's what I did. I quickly climbed up the ladder into the boat, started the bilge pump handed my daughter a small towel once she climbed down into the bilge placing the towel into the one and one-half inch hole to temporarily stop the leak. Next I located two smaller pieces of one quarter thick plywood about 6" by 10" inches and some one-inch screws. With the two pieces of wood I applied a thick bead of silicon all around edge of the wood to form a gasket type of seal. I preset the four screws in each corner of the wood patch. With a flat blade screw driver tied to me wrist, I went over the side of the boat. I gave instructions to remove the cloth and hold the first piece of wood against the hole, while I screwed the second piece of wood over the hole from the outside through the hull into the piece of wood my daughter was holding inside the hull. That was no small feat I'll tell you - unable to see the slots in the screws under just 6 inches of water. But we stopped the leak after some quick thinking. While it cut our vacation short we headed home for a permanent repair. You see we didn't know we had soft wood at that spot and we were lucky not to hit an iceberg and we were lucky to have my daughter on board. The lesson here is be prepared and a Squadron boating course is just what is needed before something like this happens to you. If you have had any harrowing experiences or near tragedies you would like to share with your fellow members, please let us know and we will print them in our soundings (anonymously if you wish).

On a more serious note - and I mean "Dead Serious" - attendance at our meetings, interest in our projects and our community service is down. Have we embarked on the wrong course? Should we be doing something new or different? We need your help with creative input and Imagineering. I for one miss the opportunities of the past of creating a better boating experience in our communities together with the fellowship of good friends.
